Originally from Warrnambool, Leah Senior has released three albums on infamous indie label Flightless.She has toured extensively throughout Australian and Europe, performing at festivals including Golden Plains and Port Fairy Folk Festival and has been nominated for best solo artist, best song and best folk album in the Age Music Victoria awards. This 1.5 hr session is for those in the early stages of developing their songwriting skills.

AUTHOR TALK - BOB HANDBY

Thursday 28th April 6.30pm

A telephone call 'out of the blue' started Bob's 30 year career with the Red Cross and Red Crescent evaluating and providing safe water and public health projects throughout the world. Released from his duties in local government, he undertook humanitarian missions to conflicts including the 'Bush War' in Uganda, Kurds fleeing Saddam Hussein in Northern Iraq, genocide in Rwanda and civil war in Sri Lanka. Bob Handby's story tells of his day to day life in the field - sad, humorous and confronting. At time facing danger and challenges, whilst working with the local people who showed incredible bravery and resilience.
