



EXPLORING OUR PAST - WARRNAMBOOL WOMEN MEAN BUSINESS Wednesday 25th October at 2pm- Bookings required.

Women have always meant business in Warrnambool ... literally ... from Mrs Kuck and her lolly shop, immortalised at Flagstaff Hill, to Effie William of Maudette's millinery, remembered by generations of customers. In the century after 1880, electoral rolls and directories reveal hundreds of dressmakers and boarding housekeepers, publicans and hairdressers, along with (more surprisingly) chemists, opticians, photographers and chiropodists. Hear some of their stories from award-winning historian Catherine Bishop who is researching a history of Warrnambool's businesswomen.

EXPAND YOUR MIND - SYMBOLS OF AUSTRALIA Thursday 26th October at 6.30pm- Bookings required.

National symbols never stand still – they are constantly changing, despite the desire to think of them as immovable. This illustrated talk surveys a range of Australia's symbols, from the formal to the popular, the commercial and the humorous, examining their origins, their many and varied meanings, and how they have changed over time. Richard White taught Australian history at the University of Sydney from 1989 to 2013. His publications include Inventing Australia, On Holidays: A History of Getting Away in Australia and Symbols of Australia.




IN CONVERSATION WITH KERRYN MAYNE

The Digital Skills Checker has been designed to assess your level of confidence doing essential, everyday activities online and provide instant, actionable steps on how to improve. Once you have signed up, learn from the huge range of Be Connected topics of your choosing at your own pace at home or at our library, where we offer fully supported and assisted weekly in person sessions guided by our Digital Mentor.
