







IN CONVERSATION WITH ROBERT GOTT Thursday 18th May at 6.30pm

The event will include Q&A and signings, with book purchases available in the library on the day, or at Collins Booksellers Warrnambool before or after the event. Bookings required.










EXPAND YOUR MIND - THE FIRST ASTRONOMERS: HOW INDIGENOUS ELDERS READ THE STARS

Thursday 25th May at 6.30pm

Guided by six Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elders, Duane Hamacher takes us on a journey across space and time to reveal the wisdom of the first astronomers. These living systems of knowledge challenge conventional ideas about the nature of science and the longevity of oral tradition. Indigenous science is dynamic, adapting to changes in the skies and on earth, pointing the way for a world facing the profound disruptions of climate change. Join us for the screening of a lecture on The First Astronomers by author, and Associate Professor of Cultural Astronomy in the ASTRO-3D Centre of Excellence and the School of Physics at the University of Melbourne, Duane Hamacher. 

U3A EVENT MYSTERIOUS STONE MARKS IN THE GRAMPIANS WITH BILL GARDNER Tuesday 23rd May at 2pm

It is generally agreed that man-made stone markings (petroglyphs) are very rare or non-existent in Western Victoria, while quite common in other states. But there is a report of marks identified as manmade near Horsham. And another site which was dismissed as "natural features". This intrigued me so over several years, the sites were located (not as easy as it sounds) and looked at first hand. This talk will explore just what is at these sites and uncover an interesting academic trail which casts doubt on the initial conclusions about them. Bookings required.


