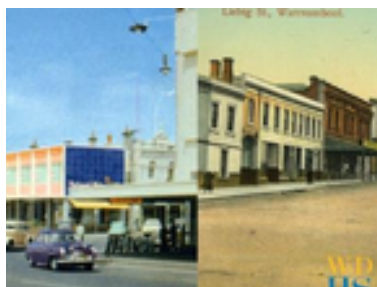

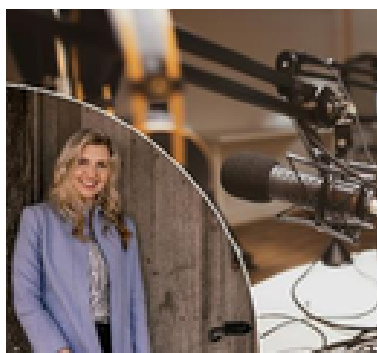


EXPLORING OUR PAST - Walking Tour - Commercial Endeavours in the CBD
